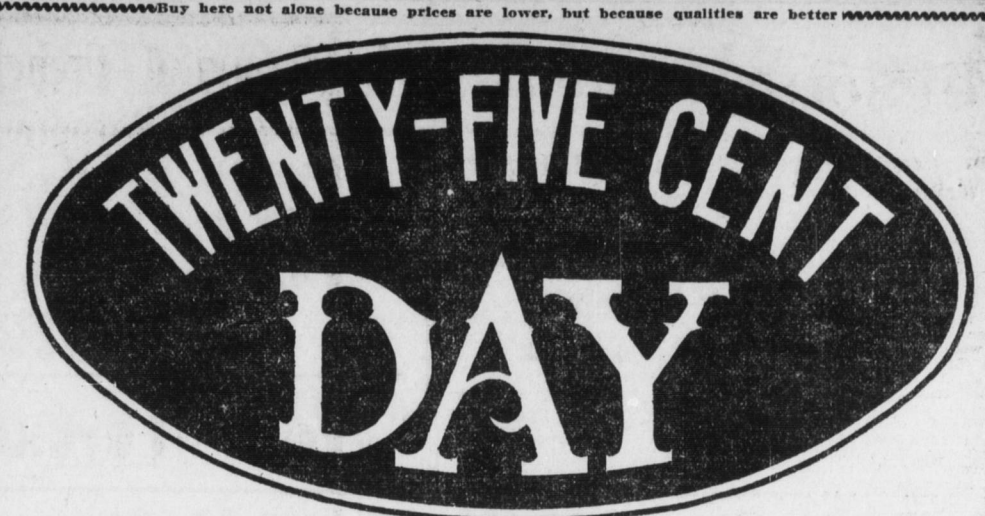

Scranton Man Instantly Killed When His Auto Strikes Team on Highway

Special to The Telegraph Gettysburg, Pa., Sept. 23.—Hurled down a 15-foot embankment when his automobile struck a team at the bridge that spans the Great Conewago creek nine miles east of Gettysburg on the York road, Harold M. Swing, Scranton, aged about 35 years, was almost instantly killed last evening at 8:30 o'clock. His machine, turned completely around in its descent over the embankment and pitched Swing from the seat. He was found about six feet from the car and died five minutes later before a physician could reach him. Swing was a traveling salesman and was coming to Gettysburg from New Oxford. The buggy that the machine struck contained a man, his wife and child. The mother and child were thrown out, but neither one of them

was seriously hurt. The automobile is a complete wreck.
