

CHICKENS SIX CENTS EACH Eggs Offered to Chinese at Three Cents a Dozen Near Hankow Special to The Telgraph Hankow, China, Sept. 15.—Prices of eggs, chickens and other poultry are so low in the Yang-tse-kiang Valley that an English company has devel-oped a large business in shipping such products to Great Britain. Virtually every Chinese family in the remote country districts, as well as in the towns and cittes, keeps chickens. The price of eggs in the villages accessible to river transporta-tion is now about 3 cents gold a dozen. Spring chickens sell for about 6 cents gold each.
