BETHEHEM AGAIN TAKES BIG JUMP

New York, Oct. 20. — Bethlehem Steel's further advance to \$119, ten points above its previous record, was the chief feature of to-day's early market, with some irregularity of prices in other parts of the list. Material particularly of note comprising the war group and United States Steel opened fractionally higher. These gains were again offset by moderate reversals in the railways, notably Baltimore and Ohio New Haven and Rock Island, London & North Western, and Erie. Mainly lower, among the few exceptions being Atchison and St. Paul.
