




## PUBLIC SERVICE ACT IS ARGUED

Superior Court Hears the Attack Made Upon the Amendment Passed at Last Session

Argument regarding the constitutionality of the act of June 3, 1915, amending the Public Service Company law of July 26, 1913, by providing that appeals may be taken directly to the Superior Court from findings of the Public Service Commission, was heard by the Superior Court yesterday. Decision was reserved by the court.

## Lehigh Valley Railroad Orders Mikado Engines

Philadelphia, Oct. 20.—The Lehigh Valley Railroad announced yesterday it had ordered 10 new Mikado freight locomotives from the Baldwin Locomotive Company, that it would have 26 of its locomotives rebuilt and equipped with superheaters, Walchaert valve gears, etc., and at the same time it had closed contracts for a considerable addition to its New York harbor equipment.

The Black Diamond is 109 feet over all, with a beam of 28 feet 1 inch and a depth of 14 feet 6 inches. It has a towing capacity of 10,000 tons.

Four 12-car capacity steel car floats and three with an eight-car capacity and eight barges have been contracted for. A 500-ton capacity gasoline hoisting lighter, just completed, has been purchased from its builders.

Including the new freight locomotives, the 20 to be overhauled and improved, the 100 locomotives recently rebuilt and equipped with superheaters and Walchaert valve gears, etc., and the 2,000 box cars rebuilt in outside shops, together with the harbor boats just ordered, the Lehigh Valley has spent over \$2,500,000 in equipment in the last few months.

## President Gets Bar of Gold For Wedding Ring

Washington, D. C., Oct. 20.—President Wilson today received a delegation of women and girls from California, who gave him a piece of gold from a California mine and also a bar of gold to make a wedding ring for Mrs. Norman Galt, his fiancée. The delegation also brought petitions signed by 300,000 Californians urging the President to visit the San Francisco exposition before it closes in December. Later the women gave to Mrs. Galt a cluster of California orange blossoms.
