## IRREGULARITY IN MARKETS SHOWN

Consolidated Gas Among Conspicuous Specialties Rising Two Points

New York, Nov. 4.—Further irregularity was shown at the opening of today's market, although gains outnumbered declines. There was additional substantial advances in telephone and telegraph shares and Studebaker led the so-called specialties with a gain of 1/2% at 166. Consolidated Gas was among the conspicuous specialties rising two points. Crucible Steel added 3/4% to 127. United States Steel was slightly lower on an offering of 2,000 shares, but soon recovered. New York Central was in active demand, but Canadian Pacific denoted increased selling. Minor rails were in good demand.
