United States Is a Nation of Monuments

If the erection of monuments expressed the gratitude of a nation, then the United States is a republic which cannot be charged with that traditional sin of republics—ingratitude. One of the youngest of nations, the United States has almost as many public memorials to its departed cilizens as any other country on earth, and no country is building them more rapidly.

Washington, for example, has almost as many monuments as it has

Washington, for example, has almost as many monuments as it has national heroes to commemorate. The city is fortunate in the possession of many little squares and circles, consisting of trees, shrubbery, flower beds and park benches, and in each of these there is always at least one monument.

and park benches, and in each of these there is always at least one monument.

Just beyond the William Tecumsch Sherman Monument my be seen the white shaft of the Washington Monument, whose picture is perhaps the most familiar image in America. It is the greatest and costliest monument ever built to any man; but now the government is preparing to surpass this record by building a memorial to Lincoln which vill cost three millions dollars more. It will be located on the bank of the Potomac River about a quarter of a mile from the Washington Monument.

But Washington has not confined its bronze and marble adulation to national heroes. There are also memorials to Dr. Samuel Gross, the surgeon; to Professor Joseph Henry, the scientist; to Hahnemann, the founder of the school of homeopathic medicine there is a monument to Daguerre, the inventor of the photograph, and, in the Capitol and the Library of Congress, two bronze statues of Robert Fulton, the inventor of the steamboat. It is a singular fact that so few of the nation's presidents have been portrayed in marble or broaze, which is the only particular in which the office of vice-president is more notable than that of the chief executive. There is a marble bust of every vice-president of the United States around the gallery of the Senate chamber.


