Supreme Court Holds it Discriminates and Awards Phila. Co. \$27,000

Washington, Nov. 16.—A decision of Washington, Nov. 16.—A decision of the greatest importance, strengthening the hands of the interstate commerce commission in its efforts to regulate the railroads, war given yesterday by the United States Supreme court, which affirmed a decision of the Pennsylvania Federal courts, awarding damages of \$27,000 to W. F. Jacoby & Co. of Philadelphia, against the Pennsylvania Railroad.

Discrimination in furnishing freight cars had been charged, Jacoby & Co. had complained to the interstate commerce commission. The commission found there had been discrimination, and ordered the railroad to pay \$21,-094.39, with interest, the total being \$27,000.

Instead of complying with the order the raffroad sought to nullify the power of the commission by refusing to pay, and the company was forced to sue under act to regulate commerce, in the Federal district court for Eastern Pennsylvania. A full verdict was rendered by the court, and the railroad appealed case to the Third Circuit Court of Appeals, the matter finally coming before the Supreme court.
