New York, Nov. 18. - Foreign selling caused general declines in the first hour, although rails were less affected than specialties. In fact, the strength of international shares, including Union Pacific, Reading and Erie, helped to restore a measure of steadiness. Trading was less active than yesterday, but embraced many issues. War shares averaged on to two points losses and Mercantile Marine, Pfd., fell three to 47 1/2. Some high-priced specialties extended early gains.
