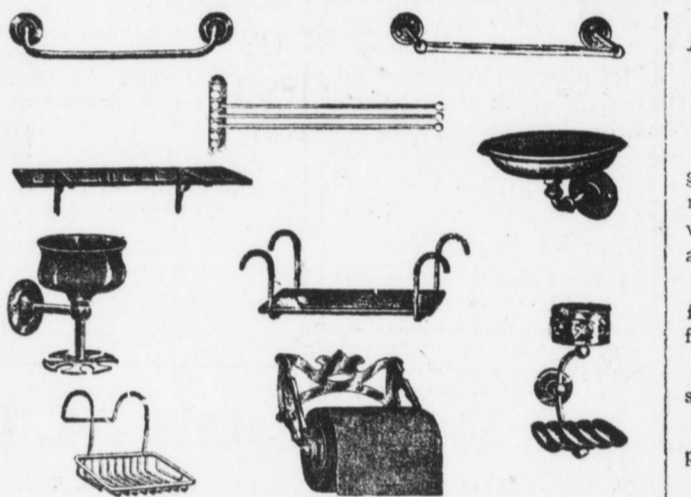

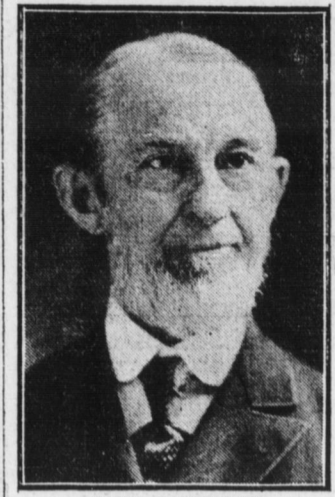

BANKER DIES AT HUMMELSTOWN

John J. Nissley, Well-Known Financier, Businessman and Church Worker

Hummelstown, Nov. 22.—John J. Nissley, president of the Hummelstown National bank and a well-known business man, died on Saturday evening after a long illness.

Mr. Nissley was 83 years old and is survived by one daughter, Mrs. J. F. Moyer, of Reading. Three brothers, Dr. Samuel R. Nissley, of Elizabethtown; the Rev. Joseph Nissley, of Derry township; Martin F. Nissley, of Hummelstown, and a sister, Miss Anna Nissley, of Harrisburg, also survive.

John J. Nissley was a son of Christian and Nancy Nissley, of Dauphin county, October 22, 1832. He received his early education in the township schools and later attended Chamberlains Commercial College at Baltimore, Md.
