Paris, Nov. 22, 12.45 P M.—The report that the Serbians have won an important victory over the Bulgarians near Leskovats, on the Nish-Saloniki raliroad 25 miles south of Nish, is corroborated in a dispatch received from the Serbian minister at Athens. The message says that after a battle of several days, in which the Bulgarians sustained enormous losses, the remnants of their army fled in disorder to the eastern bank of the Morava river.
