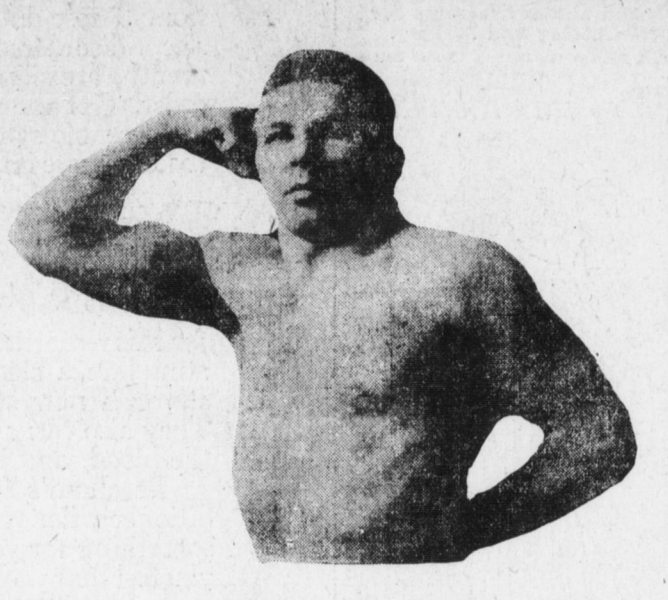
WILLIE RITCHIE WINNER

CROSS-COUNTRY RUN TO-DAY

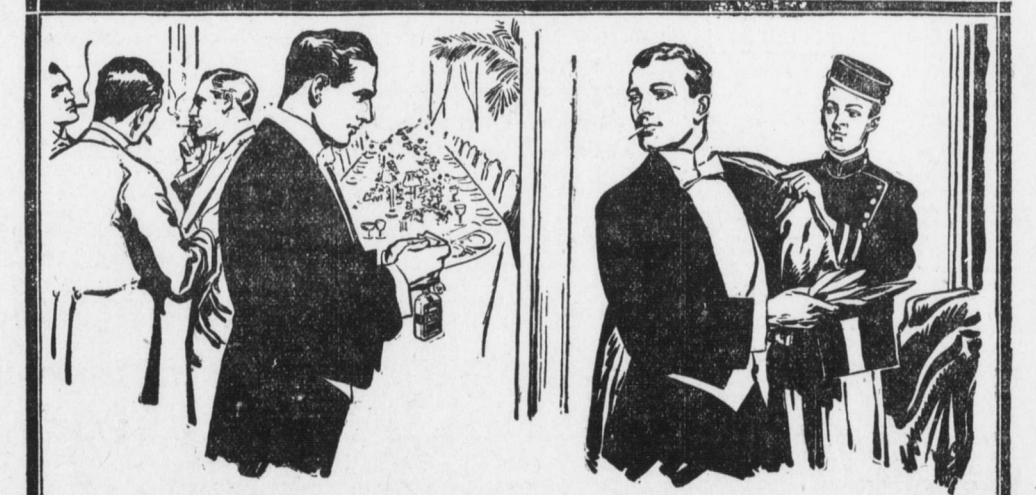
The second annual cross-country run at the Harrisburg Academy took place this afternoon. The competing teams were the Greeks and the Romans. The race started at 3:30 o'clock.
