WAR SPECIALTIES LEAD WITH GAINS

Coppers Follow Close on Their Trail; Industrials Doing Well

By Associated Press New York, Nov. 26. - High-priced specialties led off with further gains to-day and coppers followed. General Motors rose four to 430, soon completing its recent record at 435. Cuban-American Sugar also repeated its recent maximum, advancing three to 150, while Sears-Roebuck gained 3/4 at 164 1/2. Guggenheim Exploration rose one-quarter to 30, passing all previous records, and American Smelting, ex-dividend, rose 1/2 to 101. American Can, Continental Car, Crucible, Steel, Pfd., and Baldwin Locomotive were one to 2 1/2 higher. United States Steel, on Baldwin, rose 1/2 to 40,000 shares, advanced three-quarters to 87 1/2. Texas Company was reactionary, declining 5/8. Industrial and specialties of various descriptions governed the morning's trading. American Can advanced 5/8 to 100 1/2, with a new high for preferred on its point advance to 112, and Continental Can gained 5/8 at 94 1/2. Steel touched 88 and Smelting increased its gain to 10 1/2. General Motors and Cuban Sugars jumped to 47 and 155, respectively. Sears-Roebuck rose nine to 144, and Sears-Roebuck 10 to 171 1/2. Gains of one to two points came in Crucible Steel, Lackawanna and Baldwin, New York and Erie, and 2 1/2 to 7 1/2, which was later regained, checked improvement in rails. Mercantile Bank, Pfd., rose 2 1/2 at 65. Bonds were firm.
