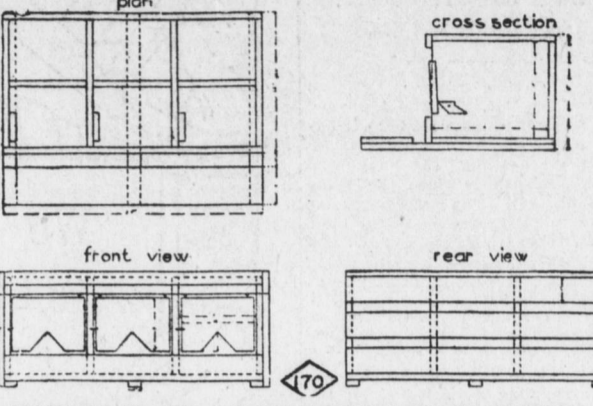
What Happened to Jane

Why the Amateur Poultryman Should Make Use of Trap-nests



HOW TO MAKE A THREE SECTION TRAPNEST COPYRIGHT, 1915.

Each nest is 12 inches wide, 14 inches high and 20 inches deep. Cut four 3/4-inch boards, 14 inches wide by 20 inches long, for ends and partitions, enough 1/2-inch boards 39 1/2 inches long to cover top, back and sides, and one strip 3/4 inch long and 3 inches wide for the front of the nests.

Trapping Is Only Practical Means of Determining Lineage For Purpose of Pedigreeing Poultry; Individual Records Must Be Kept

Trapped. Trappings, if intelligently used, aid, in picking out the best producers and eliminating the poor layers, and also aid in eliminating such birds as are affected with diseases, such as white diarrhoea. Trappings Must Be Roomy. When constructing trap-nests, or determining the type to use, the following points should be considered: The nests should be large and roomy and the entrance should be high. The egg will not be trampled upon while the hen is waiting to be removed.

necessary. In the Spring, when the birds are laying heavily it will be necessary to visit them often. A definite schedule should be planned out and followed. It is best to visit the nests and collect the eggs approximately the following hours—9, 10, 11, 12, 2 and 4.

Special Record Must Be Kept It is essential that a special record should be kept in the pen near the nests on which the numbers of the birds are placed in the vertical column at the left, and the days of the month in a horizontal column, so that the attendant has to do when recording the eggs and make a mark in the square opposite the band number under the proper date. The band number should be read immediately after recording on the record, and the bird should be placed on the floor gently, and in a short time even Leghorns will get accustomed to this additional handling, and will be much tamed thereby.

How Belle of Jersey Was Produced Belle of Jersey, a record hen, bred at the New Jersey Agricultural Experiment Station, was the definite result of tramping birds for over a period of two years. In 1911 trap-nests were placed in a pen of Leghorns, the pedigree of which was unknown. One of these nests during the winter and Spring showed the presence of one hen, No. 70-c, which was a remarkably good winter layer, producing seventy eggs during the cold months. It is interesting to say that the eggs which this bird laid during the Spring, at which time she was mated to a strong, vigorous cock, were secured, and from this mated pair, a few most excellent cockerels were secured.

Care of Birds in Cold Weather

A meeting of citizens in all of the West Shore towns in the near future and that effect an organization which could effect an organized plan for the most needed improvements and changes in the lower end of Cumberland county. P. C. Coble, a Wormleysburg business man, says that when a meeting of interested members of the City Planning Commission of Harrisburg should be called, from their time the members and their interests, what they believe is needed. Mr. Coble says the commission has made a careful study of conditions along the West Shore and that their presence at a meeting would be of great value. He also suggests that at some future time all of the West Shore citizens interested in the movement, together with the members of the planning Commission, should be taken over the "cross-river" territory in automobiles so that all could see the places where improvements are needed.

The members of the City Planning Commission are watching with interest the new movement along the West Shore. Ed S. Williams, president of the commission, said that the commission was ready to co-operate with the "cross-river" folks in every way possible. Addison M. Bowman, of Camp Hill, attorney for the boroughs of Lemoyne, Camp Hill and Wormleysburg, and a man much interested in the development of the lower end of Cumberland county, had this to say this morning regarding the formation of the new organization: "The present agitation for a West Shore Municipal League, having for its purpose the betterment of conditions in the section lying between Shiremanstown and the river and between the Yellow Breeches Creek and the North Mountain, should interest every citizen in the locality, long known as the 'lower end of Cumberland county.'
