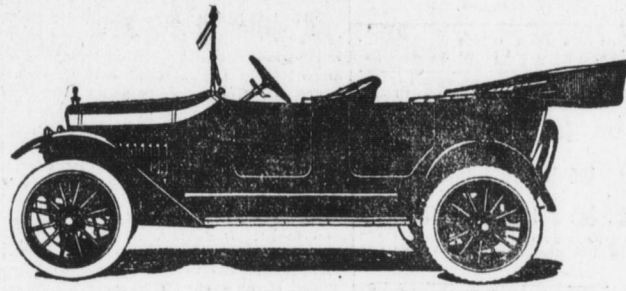

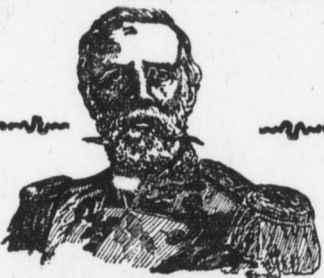

Paris, Nov. 30.—The Journal says Don Jaime of Bourbon, pretender to the Spanish throne, has again been arrested in Austria. According to this account, Don Jaime, who has been living in Italy, requested permission of Emperor Francis Joseph of Austria to visit his estate at Frohsdorf, Austria.

Don Jaime was arrested at Frohsdorf last year for addressing to his partisans an appeal to side with France in the war. He was released on condition that he leave the country.
