SHARES BOUND MAINLY FORWARD

New York, Dec. 1. - Changes in standard shares were slight, but mainly upward in today's early dealings, while specialties once more bounded forward, South Porto Rico Sugar advancing 7 to 163 and Cuban American Sugar 2 to 175, both new records. Pronounced gains were also made by Sears Roebuck, Texas Company, Diamond Match and United States Industrial Alcohol, the latter scoring a new maximum on its 4 1/2-point rise to 129 1/2. American coal products and such recent favorites as Baldwin Locomotive, Crucible Steel, Lackawanna Steel were appreciably higher. American Can was fractionally lower and New Haven fell a point to 75 1/2.

Some specialties added to early gains, while others became reactionary. American Can preferred fell 2 to 110 on failure of the directors to act on the deferred dividend and Diamond Match and Mercantile Marine preferred were lower by 2 points or more. An isolated feature was the 20-point rise to 185 in G. W. Helme, one of the tobacco group, on declaration of an increased dividend. In the main, however, the market was one of professional manipulation. Railways were more neglected than usual, some active stocks of this class remaining untraded. Trading in the second hour was nominal. Bonds were steady.
