MORE NORMAL CONDITIONS RULE

Railroad Shares Slump Slightly; Special Stocks Feverishly Active

New York, Dec. 16.—More normal conditions prevailed on the resumption of trading to-day, yesterday's heavy dealings in Anglo-French war bonds being lacking. That issue, however, repeated its minimum quotation of 94 1/2 for future delivery, but the low price regular way was 94 1/2. Initial advances included Mercantile Marine, Pfd., and Louisville and Nashville, each gaining a point or more, while Canadian Pacific, Norfolk and Western and Union Pacific were lower. United States Steel changed hands in 1,000 to 2,500 shares at a fraction under yesterday's close.

Special stocks were feverishly active in the first hour with considerable profit-taking in the petroleum issues, Baldwin Locomotive, Marine, Pfd., and Studebaker, those shares reacting two or three points, while General Motors, Baldwin Locomotive, Marine, Pfd., and Studebaker were irregular, falling from 8 1/2 to 8 1/4, while rails drifted to lower levels. Prices were generally unchanged from the opening. War stocks were the feature of the second hour, prices being mostly steady, with oil again at noon. Bonds were lower.
