PENROSE HAS PENSION BILL

Superannuated Employees of Government Would Be Retired With Annuity

A new form of pension retirement for civilian employees of the government is provided in a bill which Senator Penrose has just reintroduced in the Senate. The bill provides that the Postmaster General shall grant an indefinite leave of absence together with an allowance of \$600 per annum to any persons employed in the railway mail service, rural free delivery, city free delivery service, post office clerks and other employment of the post office who are in the classified civil service and who have become incapacitated from performing their duties on account of superannuation.

The proposal of Senator Penrose last year was tacked on the Post Office Appropriation bill, but was eliminated on a point of order. The bill as now introduced provides that should it be necessary to appoint a substitute to fill the place of an employee who has been granted a leave of absence, he shall be paid at the rate allowed for vacation work.

Boards of retirement would be appointed to examine all applications for the granting of indefinite leaves of absence, which are virtually equivalent to a retirement program.

In discussing his plan in the Senate, Senator Penrose said: "In the beginning I was opposed to this proposition. It did not seem to me that the government ought to go into the business of what has been described in a term of opprobrium as a civil pension list. Then, after I looked into the matter a little further it seemed to me that if the government did adopt a retirement system, accompanied by some half pay or some proportion of pay, the fund should be made up by contributions in the nature of a relief fund or pension fund made by monthly or periodical payments by the employees.

"Then I got a little further, in the lapse of years, and I suppose with wisdom and an evidence of lack of wisdom to develop and progress and change one's mind, until I became convinced that the only practical system was a system of flat, straight direct retirement and pension. I was led to that conclusion also by noting the development of the corporations of the country, representing large aggregations of capital employing an army of men who, it seemed to me, according to my study and observation, gradually evolved and devel-

oped into the conclusion of a flat, direct retirement system. "In the early days of retirement systems, inaugurated originally, I suppose, by the railroads of the country, there was no system of retirement and the part of the employee. Those systems have been quite elaborately worked out, and I have no doubt have been beneficial in their results. But we live in an age of rapid development, and the most recent systems adopted by the great corporations of the country, have evolved beyond this country, and embody a program of flat retirement.

"The United States government is the only government of all the leading civilized governments in the world that has no system of retirement for its superannuated civil service employees. The custom of practice of all governments, whether National, State or municipal, in their dealings with their people and employees certainly should furnish some precedent and example for the Federal government of the United States. Instead of having the distinction of taking the lead in this kind of legislation and setting the example to States and municipalities, to school boards and corporations, we have invited much harsh criticism and have not in any way taken the initiative in this kind of legislation for the relief of the vast army of the employees under the civil service in the government."

How would you like to stand for hours in the cold without an overcoat? Makes you shiver, doesn't it? Yet that is just what hundreds of horses are doing daily. The blanketing of automobiles is never neglected. Why horses are not equally considered of a horse? The Harrisburg Society for the Prevention of the Cruelty to Animals is receiving daily calls about unblanketed horses. In every instance the case is investigated, the owners warned, and for repeated offenses, fined.

Down in Atlanta, Ga., they have experimented successfully with burlap shoes for horses, to be used on hilly paved streets where horses fall, particularly when drawing heavy loads. These shoes are placed by the humane society in stores adjacent to dangerous inclines, and the drivers are carefully given taken advantage of them.

The Washington, D. C. Animal Rescuer League of the way for these shoes made for horses by women who are out of employment. They have large orders placed for these shoes, which have proved very useful in slippery streets.

The Harrisburg Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals has been busy these past few days by calls from all over the city regarding horses that are falling or stumbling in slippery streets. This shows a growing knowledge of the influence of the city that is most encouraging. A further sign is the help given by householders in standing or putting ashes on dangerous places in the streets.
