WAR ISSUES LOSE BIG FRACTIONS

Irregular Gains and Losses Recorded; Steel and Mexican Shares Are Depressed

By Associated Press
New York, Jan. 13.—Irregular gains and losses were recorded in today's initial dealings on relatively small turnover. United States Steel was the only stock to issue in more than moderate amounts, lots of 1,500, 1,900 and 2,500 shares changing hands at 85 1/2, against yesterday's close of 84 1/2.

Mexican Petroleum and American Smelting were heavy while some of the war issues lost substantial fractions. Yesterday's active specialties, notably the sugar group, Industrial Alcohol, Crucible Steel and Mercantile Marine were again to the fore at material advances.

The short interest resorted to recent tactics to affect the opening in an effort to depress prices. Steel fell to 85% and Mexican Petroleum, which was more active than Steel, repeated yesterday's
