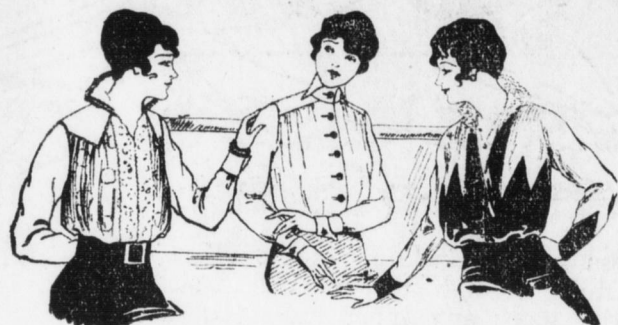

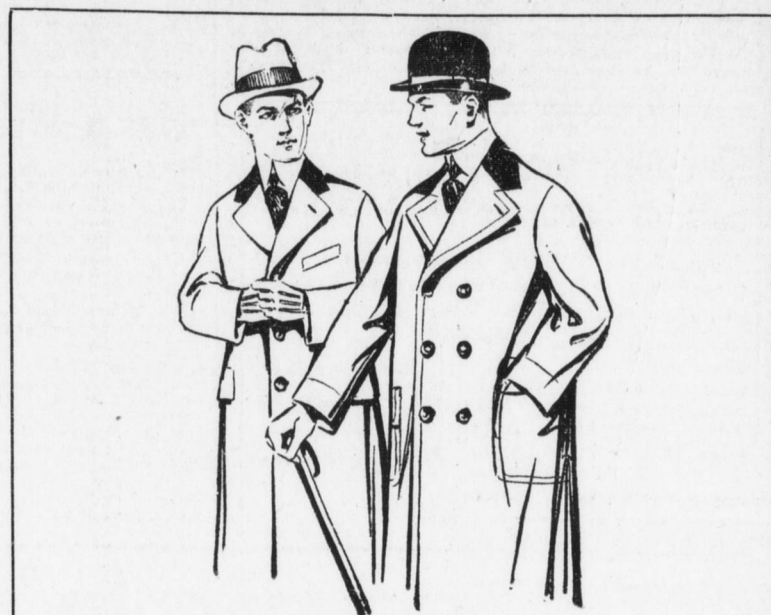

Rumanians Want Bids on Five Million Horseshoes

New York, Jan. 14. — One of the most interesting foreign inquiries that have come out recently is for 5,000,000 horseshoes for the Rumanian Government. Each horseshoe weighs on an average about two pounds, based on No. 4, indicating that about 10,000,000 pounds, or 5,000 tons, of steel will be required in the execution of this order. The shoes are packed fifty to sixty in

a keg of 100 pounds, which means that the purchase will cover about 100,000 kegs. It is understood that only a portion of the contract has been closed because of the difficulty of obtaining desired shipments. This inquiry recalls the placing of a similar contract for 100,000 kegs of horseshoes with American producers early in the war, of which 35,000 to 40,000 kegs were furnished by the American Steel and Wire Company.
