WAR SHARES SHOW FURTHER ADVANCE

New High Records Made in Speculative Issues While Standard Stocks Go Up

By Associated Press

New York, Jan. 17.—The week opened with further advances in a few of the more speculative issues, new high records being made by International Nickel, American Coal Products and Mercantile Marine preferred. Crucible Steel, Bethlehem Steel, American Can, New York Airbrake and General Electric were higher by substantial fractions to two points. Standard shares showed no material change. Utilities added to recent advance.

Weakness of the oils and other specialties provoked fresh selling before the end of the first hour, even the more buoyant issues forfeiting much of their early gain. United States Steel and leading rails were under last Saturday's final prices and Bethlehem Steel fell 9 to 470. Marine Petroleum, Standard Oil, and others in the common and preferred shares as well as the 4 1/2 per cent. certificates exceeding the trading in other securities.

Later Mexican stocks, including Mexican Petroleum and Smelting, scored marked recoveries, but investment shares continued heavy. Bonds were irregular.
