New York, Jan. 22.—Wall Street. —

Canadian Pacific and New York Central were the only features of the railway group at moderate declines.

To-day's brief session was extremely dull and completely lacking in outside interest. Even the trading element showed no disposition to undertake fresh committments, except in some of the specialties which recently formed the center of speculative activity.
