STEEL ACTIVE ON EVE OF MEETING

Specialties and War Shares Show Strength While Railroads Go Higher

New York, Jan. 25.—The significant feature of to-day's early trading was the strength and activity of United States Steel, whose directors met after the close of to-day's session on the exchange. Steel opened with a block of 2,000 shares at \$4 to \$4 1/2 as against yesterday's closing price of \$3 1/2. This was followed by numerous other lots of 1,000 to 7,000 shares up to \$5.

There were gains in specialties and war issues, while Baltimore and Ohio and New York Central were substantially higher. These advances were counterbalanced, however, by declines in Erie, Southern Railway preferred and oils. Industrial Alcohol, after advancing 2 points, fell back 5.

Trading in Steel during the moderate first hour was larger than the combined output in all other active issues, approximately 60,000 shares. Steel's rise was met by some profit taking, the stock reacting a substantial fraction with heaviness in such specialties as industrial Alcohol, Baldwin Locomotive, the oils and a few iron issues. Late in the day, however, Steel, the Pacifics and other representative stocks imparted renewed strength to the general list, but dealings were few and the market was stagnant. Bonds were steady.
