The Operation of the Initiative, Referendum, and Recall in Oregon—by James D. Barnett, Ph. D. (published by MacMillan, New York, \$2.)

The scheme of referendum and recall has always been a bone of contention, seemingly since the memory of man, and it is interesting to study the operation of the system of initiative and referendum in a State where for over thirteen years it has been in vogue. After a ten year's light, the system was adopted and embodied in the constitution of Oregon, the main cause which led to its adoption having been the feeling on the part of the people that the government was getting away from them and they desired a more direct control both in the making and the enforcing of the laws.

Professor Barnett is Professor of Oregon, and well qualified to discuss the workings of the system of initiative and referendum. The book will be found of great value by all students of government.

### TREASURY FUNDS **SHOW BIG SLUMP**

Working Fund Less Than it Has Been For Many, Many Months at the Capitol

Pennsylvania's State Treasury con-Pennsylvania's State Treasury con-tained \$2,571,622.06, including the sinking fund of \$651,110.02, at the close of January business, touching the lowest point known in over sixteen years or more. The total of the balances was less than half of the total ances was less than half of the total one year ago, when they amounted to \$5,654,985.52. One month ago the balances amounted to \$3,251,408.51 and two months ago to \$4,617,202.59.
