## MAY NAME BOARD OF 3 EXPERTS ON COAL ASSESSMENT

**County Commissioners** Considering Plan to Obtain Information

Coal lands in the upper end of the county will be investigated by a survey board of three qualified members to assist in making a fair and impartial county assessment, if a plan now being considered by the county commissioners is adopted.

The plan in brief provides that the county commissioners appoint one member who shall be a mining engineer and if possible a realty expert; another to be named by the coal companies, and a third to be appointed by the newspapers or individuals who have been assisting the revision of the coal land assessments.

Eight ward appeals were considered by the commissioners to-day and the revision was confined as far as possible to coincide with the city's assessment. To-morrow the commissioners will go to Wilkes-Barre, Pa. and some of the board will have to go up to-night—around about 3:45 to-morrow morning.
