FOREIGN TRADE CONVENTION HELD AT NEW ORLEANS

Commercial Preparedness and Export Co-operation the Dominant Note. OVER 500 DELEGATES.

"Greater Prosperity Through Greater Foreign Trade."—That was the slogan which prompted the recent great assembly at New Orleans, Louisiana, on January 27, 28 and 29 of the delegates to the Third National Foreign Trade Convention.

On the "Foreign Trade Special" which ran from New York to New Orleans and return, taking a little over two days for the trip each way, were some 150 men from the east and north, representing about one-third of the entire aggregation which was present for the convention.

The dominant note in the addresses and discussions was the inevitable condition of trade after the war, the certain invasion of our domestic markets by foreign competition, rehabilitation of foreign trade, and the capture of our foreign markets, unless we prepare now to meet that condition by export co-operation and commercial preparedness.

Arguments for investment in South and Central America were put forward, the relation of the tariff to world trade conditions after the war, as well as credits and the banking situation in the addresses of such men as A. J. Findley, editor of The Iron Age; James A. Farrell, president of the United States Steel Corporation; Alba B. Johnson, president of the Baldwin Locomotive Works, of Philadelphia; Professor Henry C. Emery, former chairman of the United States tariff board under Taft, and Frank A. Vanderbilt, president of the National City Bank of New York City.

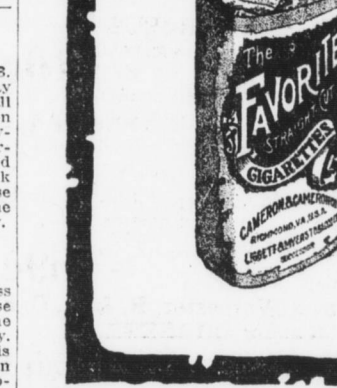
