### Mid-Atlantic Suffrage Union in Conference

New York, Feb. 11.—More than 300 delegates from New York, New Jersey, Delaware, Pennsylvania and Maryland attended to-day the first Mid-Atlantic States Conference of the Women's Congressional Union to consider plans for obtaining the passage of the Susan B. Anthony amendment to the federal Constitution. This amendment provides for woman suffrage.

The delegates considered plans to continue their work in advocacy of the amendment during the remainder of the present session of Congress and discussed arrangements for raising a fund to carry their campaign to the western states, where it is thought the influence of the woman voters can be brought to bear directly upon their representatives in Congress.

### Four-Masted Schooner Is Destroyed by Fire at Sea

New York, Feb. 11.—The four-masted schooner John Bossert, of this port, was virtually destroyed by fire five miles at sea off the highlands of Navesick, N. J., early to-day.

Captain Pressey and the crew of seven men were taken off the burning vessel by the pilot boat New York and were brought ashore by the crew of the Seabright coast guard station. Three of the sailors were severely burned.

The Bossert was loaded with lumber and bound from Georgetown, S. C., to New York.

### MORGAN IN LONDON

London, Feb. 11.—J. Pierpont Morgan arrived in London this morning by special train from Falmouth, where last evening he landed from the Holland-America steamship Rotterdam on which he had come from New York. He was met at the station here by Lord Sunlife, governor of the Bank of England.

### POLSTAD IN KIRKWALL

London, Feb. 8, 6:30 p. m. (delayed by censor).—The Norwegian steamer Polstad, from Baltimore, January 1, for Aalborg with a cargo of maize, has been taken into Kirkwall.

### IRON CROSSES FOR RAIDERS

London, Feb. 11.—Reuter's Copenhagen correspondent says that the German Emperor has bestowed the highest German military decoration, the Order Pour Le Merite, on the commander in chief of the Zeppelin raiding squadron which recently attacked English towns. Iron crosses, it is added, have been distributed among the Zeppelin crews.

### ORCHESTRA CANCELS ITS ENGAGEMENT IN CANADA

New York, Feb. 11.—The Damrosch New York Symphony Orchestra has canceled its engagement to give concerts in Montreal and Ottawa, Canada, because of objections which have been raised there to the advent of German members of the orchestra.
