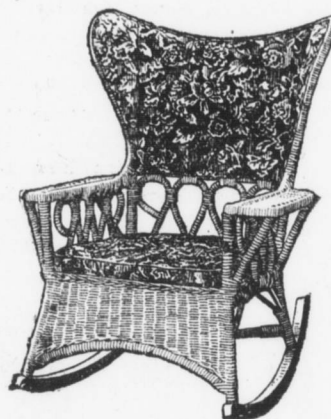

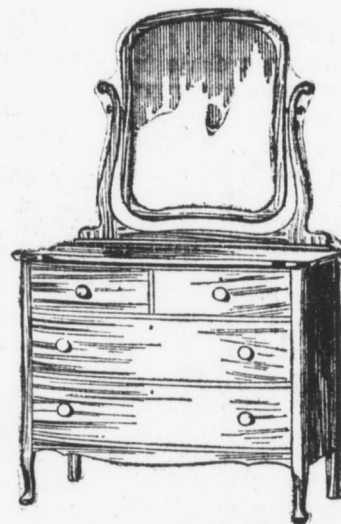

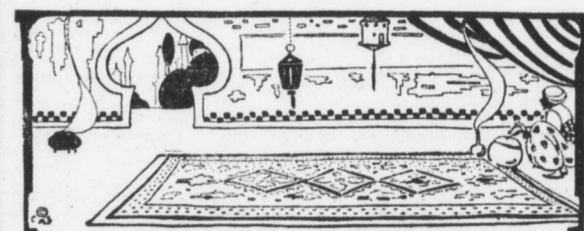

### Poor Board Obtains Number of County's Small Dependents; Other Details

More detailed information as to incorporation, methods and scope of charitable and philanthropic work and other matters relative to the conduct of the numerous children's institutions of Harrisburg will be asked by the poor directors before passing finally upon the year's appropriations.

The directors, while desirous of continuing to extend county assistance to these homes and charitable organizations, want to make sure such appropriations are legal in order to avoid possible complications in the future. With this idea in mind the directorate at a recent meeting asked all the institutions to submit a report in detail as to their legal standing, number of youngsters cared for by county, support, etc. Reports of the number of children maintained in these institutions by the county total seventy-one, according to data just submitted. The additional information is expected at the next session of the directors.
