MARYSVILLE CASE WILL CLOSE TODAY

Commissioner Ryan Will Receive Briefs in Shannon's Complaint

The complaint of John F. Shannon, Jr., and others of Marysville, and other West Shore towns, against the service on the Marysville line of the Valley Railway Company, was closed except for the filing of briefs and argument before Public Service Commissioner Michael J. Ryan at the Capitol to-day.

The company submitted figures showing the cost of operation of its system and what an additional car on the Marysville line would cost, the figures being presented in great detail.

Commissioner Ryan heard the complaint of James H. Maurer, member of

the Legislature from Reading, and president of the State Federation of Labor, against the Oley Valley Railway Company, which operates a nineteen-mile trolley line out of Reading. Mr. Maurer contended that toilets should be installed, but the company contended that it would cause contamination of streams.

Mr. Ryan rendered a decision to-day in which he decided that the complaint of William S. Adams, of Mt. Taber, Adams county, against the Philadelphia and Reading, over station facilities, should be marked satisfied. The company established a full agency station at Peach Glen.

In a decision by Commissioner Shannon he dismisses the complaint of the New Castle Box Company against the City of New Castle Water Company a rate case.
