UNITED EVANGELICAL SESSION TO HEAR ENCOURAGING REPORTS

Harrisburg Preachers Will Tell of Remarkable Growth During Last Year; Announce Guests and Hosts During Sessions

Encouraging reports will be made by the pastors of the United Evangelical churches of this city at the East Pennsylvania conference session to be held in the Harris Street United Evangelical Church this week, when several hundred ministers and lay delegates will be in attendance.

The Rev. G. F. Schaum, pastor of the Harris Street church will make the following report at the close of the year's work. A number of new members were received during the year. Present membership, 377; net increase, 5; enrollment of Sunday school, 505; average attendance during the year, 266; money raised by Sunday school, \$591.00; Keystone League of Christian Endeavor membership, 60 active, 4 associate; average attendance, 53; Junior C. E. membership, 67; average attendance, 41; Woman's Missionary Society, membership, 62; money raised, \$163; mission

band, membership, 69; money raised, \$35.71; total amount of money raised for all purposes by the congregation, \$5,396.

Rev. Mr. Hangen's Report

The Rev. A. E. Hangen, pastor of the Park Street Church, read his annual report last evening to the congregation at the closing services of the conference year. The report is as follows: Number of conversions, 67; received by certificate, 28; received by profession, 72; church membership, 425; net gain, 69; Sunday school enrollment, officers and teachers, 27; scholars, 550; cradle roll, 44; money raised by Sunday school, \$644; average attendance, 287; scholars converted, 40; Keystone League of Christian Endeavor, membership, 82 active, 3 associate; average attendance, 45; money raised, \$50; Junior C. E. membership, 60; average attendance, 40; money raised, \$9.00; Women's Missionary Society, membership, 71; average attendance, 25; money raised, \$18.6; Young People's Society, membership, 53; average attendance, 30; money raised, \$63; mission band, membership, 37; average attendance, 25; money raised, \$17. 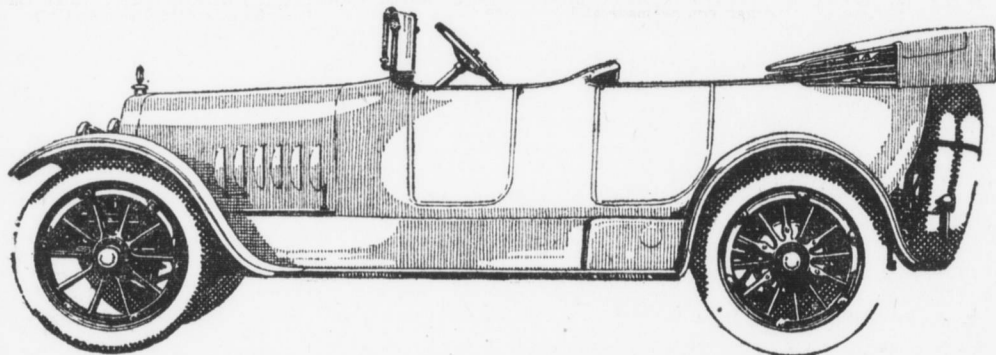
