Iron Ore Properties

The Bethlehem Iron Mines Company, organized in 1913 to operate extensive iron ore deposits near Coalinga, Calif., control of which was acquired in 1912 by the Bethlehem Steel Corporation. This ore is said to lie on the surface and run about 67 per cent., or 16 per cent. higher than the usual run of open pit Lake Superior ores.
