record of National Guard service. Senator McKee Named In addition to naming Mr. Kearns, the National Guard appointments of the day designate Senator W. S. McKee, of Pittsburgh, commander of the Fourteenth Regiment, to be the first colonel of the new regiment of field artillery. The colonel is well known to many people here. The lieutenant-colonel of the Fourteenth, A. V. Crookston, Pittsburgh, was appointed lieutenant-colonel; Major Theodore R. McLain, Pittsburgh, and

Captain Thomas O. Cole, South Bethlehem, majors; Captain Robert G. Snyder, Pittsburgh, to command Battery F; William G. Fullman, Pittsburgh; Harry Howe, Bellevue; Harry L. Probst, Edgewood Park, and William K. Weaver, Jr., Wilkensburg, to be first lieutenants. Second Lieutenant Herbert M. Paul, Battery A, South Bethlehem, was appointed a captain of artillery and assigned to command Battery A at that

place, succeeding Captain Cole. Major B. L. Succop, Eighteenth Regiment, Pittsburgh, was appointed lieutenant-colonel to succeed Colonel Kearns, and Captain John K. Clement, adjutant, Eighteenth Infantry, appointed major. Second Lieutenant Joel Spry, Plymouth, appointed first lieutenant and assigned to Company I, Ninth Infantry. Captain Paul V. Heffner, Company F, Eighth Infantry, Huntingdon, was

placed on the retired list at his own request. The Eighth's Inspection Orders for the spring inspection of the National Guard by the Guard officers were issued from the adjutant general's office at 1 o'clock this afternoon and make the customary provisions. Sanitary detachment, Tamaqua, Friday, April 14. Company A, York, Thursday, May 4. Company B, Tamaqua, Friday, April 14. Company C, Chambersburg, Friday, May 5. Company D, Harrisburg, Tuesday, April 11. Company E, Mahanoy City, Thursday, April 13. Company F, Huntingdon, Wednesday, April 19. Company G, Carlisle, Wednesday, April 12. Company H, Pottsville, Monday, April 17. Company I, Harrisburg, Monday, April 19. Company K, York, Wednesday, May 3. Company L, Bedford, Thursday, April 20. 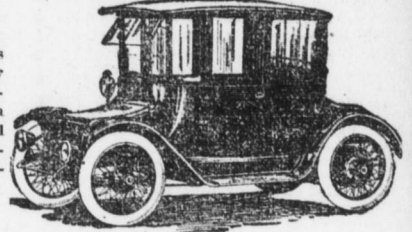
