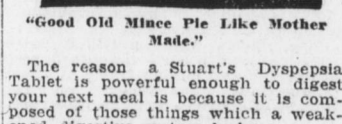

Following is the text of the President's letter to Representative Poy: "The White House, Washington, Feb. 29, 1916. My Dear Mr. Poy: Inasmuch as I learn that Mr. Henry, the chairman of the Committee on Rules, is absent in Texas, I take the liberty of calling your attention, as ranking member of the committee, to a matter of grave concern to the country, which, I believe, should be handled under the rules of the House only by that committee."

Administration Will Make Time on Armed Ships Until Congress Settles Down

Washington, March 1.—Germany's latest assurances on the conduct of submarine warfare presented Monday by Count Von Bernstorff to Secretary Lansing, are not so broad as the United States desired, but it is indicated no further steps will be taken by the government until the administration is certain its action will not be embarrassed in Congress.
