

Baseball Is Link Between Prelates of Old and New Gospel

Baltimore, March 4.-Two men whose names are probably known wherever the English language is spoken had a nice little chat in North harles street yesterday, and the hief topic of conversation was—bas all. They were James Cardinal Gibbon


