

Preparing to Force Allied Blockade of the Adriatic

Rome, March 9. — Two of the most cowerful of Austria's dreadmaughts are being prepared in a Dalmatian cort, the Tribuna says, with the intension of repeating the exploit of the ormer German vessels Goeben and Sreslau and forcing the allies' blockade of the Adriatic, in order to reach the Dardanelles and bring assistance o Turkey in the Black Sea, as the dituation of the latter is growing descrete, owing to the Russian naval apprenacy in those waters.

For this reason, the newspaper adds, the floating mines which obtructed the Dardanelles have been wept up by the Turks and the Germans in order to clear a way for the Austrian battleships which are expected.
