According to Colonel Bertani, Carranza commander at Casas Grandes, part of General Pershing's troops are near Galena, some thirty miles south-east. Dispatches to General Gabriel Gaviro, commanding the Carranza forces at Juarez, say that Villa is in the Babicora Lake region on the ranch of Mrs. Phoebe Hearst.

Villa Doubles to Escape Net Thrown Out by U. S. and Carranza Troops

El Paso, Texas, March 20.—Villa has doubled east and south to Namiquipa, according to a telegram received by General Gaviro at Juarez to-day. He reports that Carranza troops are advancing from the south while the Americans are continuing their march from the north in an effort to close the net around the bandit.

Activities of Troops at Columbus Indicate That More Men Will Be Sent in

Columbus, N. M., March 20.—Increased activity on the part of the troops stationed here and the arrival during the night of a number of military trains indicated to-day that additional forces shortly will be on their way to augment the punitive American expeditionary force now in the field in northern Mexico.

Wrightsville, Pa., March 20.—John H. Hiller, a prominent resident of Stillitz, York county, died in his seventy-fifth year. His wife and twenty-two children survive. There are many grandchildren and great-grandchildren and he had the largest family in this section.

Suit Against Traction Co. For Drowning of Daughter

Mifflintown, Pa., March 20.—County Superintendent Cloyd E. Kauffman today left for Washington, D. C., to present when the suit he brought against the city traction company is called for trial. The action is the result of the drowning of Mr. Kauffman's daughter several years ago in Chevy Chase Park pond, owned by the traction company.

Not Believed Troops Will Clash With Villa Forces For Several Days

San Antonio, Texas, March 20.—Little reason to believe that a clash between the American troops and Francisco Villa and his bandits would occur to-day, or even to-morrow, was indicated in reports to-day to Major-General Funston from General Pershing, commander of the expeditionary forces.

Troops Notified Not to Enter Any Towns in Answer to Protest of Carranza

Washington, D. C., March 20.—General Carranza has formally protested against American troops occupying Casas Grandes in their pursuit of Villa. The American Government has replied that the troops have been notified specifically not to occupy Casas Grandes nor any towns in Mexico.

Large Mansion Burned

Waynesboro, Pa., March 20.—Fire destroyed the large twelve-room stone mansion house of William R. Early, near Kauffman's Station, on Friday night, together with contents, entailing a loss of \$5,000. There were sixty bushels of potatoes and a big quantity of canned goods in the cellar, all of which were burned. The fire was caused by an overheated stovepipe.
