### Navy Recruiting Station Opened in Bergner Bldg.

Permanent recruiting headquarters for the United States Navy have been opened in this city, on the third floor of the Bergner building and enlistments may be made there for all branches of the navy by men between the ages of 17 and 30.

J. E. Nicholson, chief boatswain's mate and S. Landy, boatswain's mate, first class, are in charge of the office which is open daily from 9 o'clock in the morning until 5 o'clock in the afternoon.

There are fifty different trades in the navy branch of service and a young man can learn one of these thoroughly before his term of enlistment expires. Numerous applicants are expected here for this reason, and an increase in pay is offered to any one who has been honorably discharged from one enlistment in the navy and wishes to re-enlist. Both of the men in charge of the local office have been in the navy about fourteen years, and have had wide experience, visiting many parts of the world. The office here will be a permanent one.
