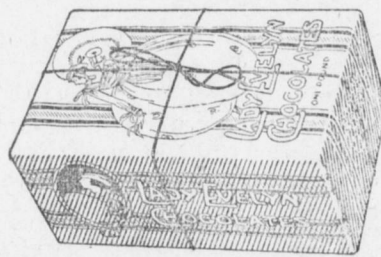

BIRD TENANTS REQUIRE BATH-ROOMS

"Water is just as important to the birds as foods," says a writer in the May Woman's Home Companion, "and sometimes is harder for them to find. Any plans for attracting birds must include some sort of water supply, both for drinking and bathing. It is almost impossible to

let an apartment to these tenants without a bathroom.

"A bird bath can be made a very attractive feature of the garden. All the taste and money one has can be lavished on it. 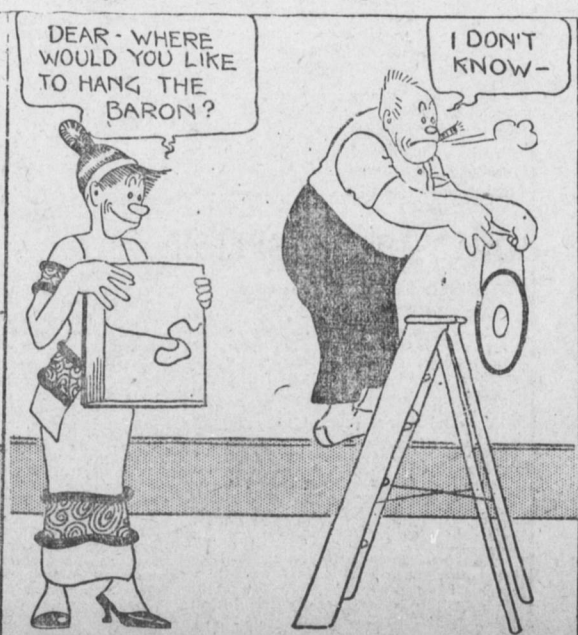
