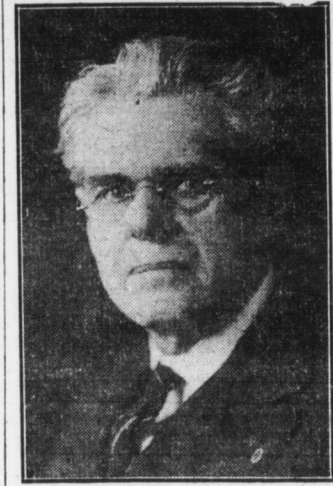
SIX MECHANICSBURG MEN BORN MAY 6 CELEBRATE ANNIVERSARY

For Twenty-two Years Members of Birthday Party Have Been Observing Event With Banquet Each Year

Mechanicsburg, Pa., May 8.—Saturday evening John C. Reeser was host at a birthday dinner of unusual interest, at his home in West Main street, when his guests were five men, whose birthdays, including his own, all occur on May 6, of various ages. The late George W. Hauck instituted the celebration in this manner of the birthday anniversaries and has been regularly observed for the past twenty-two years. The original members were George W. Hauck and Dick Charles, both deceased; George Zacharias, John Attick and John C. Reeser; later William M. Koller joined the list, followed by Walter Zacharias and S. Harper Myers. Relative to the celebration is a touching incident in the fact that the deceased members are not forgotten and on the morning of May 6, annually, a floral emblem is placed on the grave of each, in token of a cherished friendship of bygone days.

At the birthday comes around, it is customary for each member, in turn, to entertain at dinner, plans for which are made a long time in advance, and look forward to as a most important event. Countess Markievicz, Revolt Leader Gets Life Penal Term; Death Sentences Commuted

Dublin, May 8.—Countess Georgina Markievicz, one of the prominent figures in the Irish revolt, was sentenced to death after her trial by court-martial, but the sentence has been commuted to penal servitude for life. It was officially announced a death sentence upon Henry O'Hanrahan also was commuted to a life term.

Death sentences imposed upon George Plunkett and John Plunkett, brothers of Joseph Plunkett, who was shot last week, have been commuted to ten years' penal servitude.

It is unofficially announced that a death sentence upon Philip Cosgrave has been commuted to five years' imprisonment, and the sentence of thirteen others to three years' imprisonment.

No official figures have yet been issued on the deaths of civilians in the recent revolt, but 160 already have been accounted for.

NEW UNDER SECRETARY

London, May 8.—Sir Robert Chambers, who has been governor of Ceylon since 1913, has been appointed to succeed Sir Matthew Nathan as under secretary for Ireland. Sir Matthew resigned simultaneously with Augustine Birrell, chief secretary for Ireland, who relinquished his post last week shortly after it appeared that the Irish uprising was well under control.
