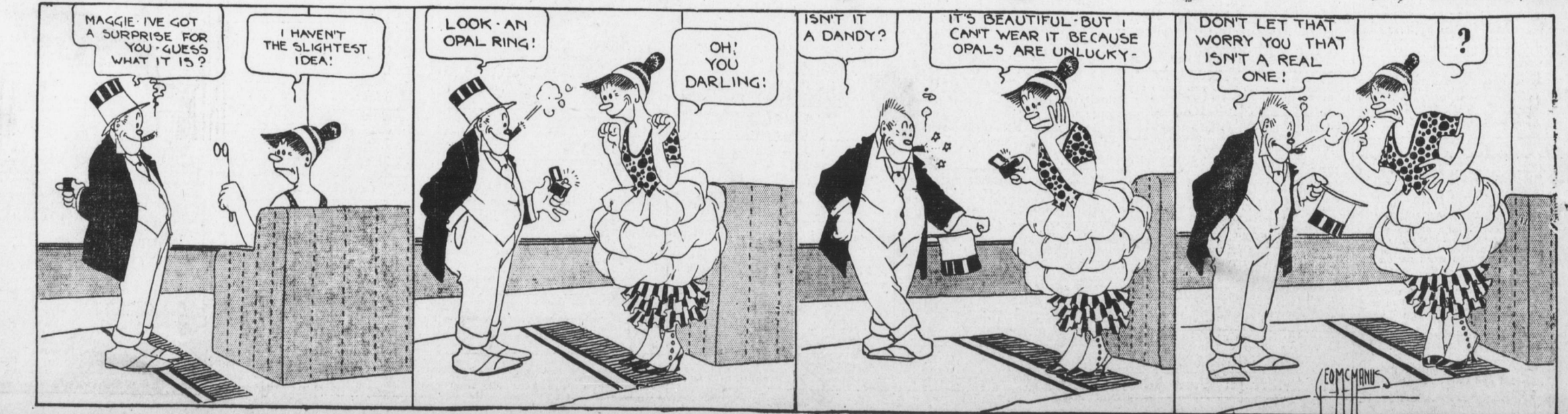
**MEETING OF L. S. SOCIETY**
