**Bible Class of Poker Players Causes Stir**  
Mansfield, O., May 12.—The resolve of a group of men of Butler, a village in the southern part of Richland county, to spend their Sunday afternoons at Sunday school instead of sitting in a poker game has caused a flood of scurrilous anonymous letters that has stirred the village population of 800 and has started an investigation by the postoffice authorities.

The poker players, numbering at least 20 men, including some of the leaders in the village, formed a Bible class. The Sunday afternoon poker game had been regarded as a weekly rite for many years. The men renounced the game in a body and unanimously joined the new devotional activity.

Five persons prominent in the village have been targets for the letters. The envelopes were addressed in a feminine hand, the villagers say.
