**35 German Socialists Shot For Peace Activity**

Geneva, Switzerland, May 12.—Swiss Socialists report they have received information that three German officers and thirty-two soldiers, all Socialists, have been shot for distributing in the trenches a pamphlet concerning the second Socialist peace conference at Zimmerwald, near Berne.

At this conference protests were made by Socialists of many countries against methods of warfare which the delegates said had been adopted by the Germans.
