"My mother doesn't want me to go with you," he said. "I can't do without you, and there isn't anything else to do. I am going to shoot myself at 2.30 in the morning." After church they went to the grove near the railroad tracks. It had always been sacred to sweethearts, that grove. Now it was to be the resting-place of death.

The boy and the girl sat down on a log. It was damp and chilly and they had several hours to wait. "Is your watch right?" the boy asked, fear a while. The girl inspected the little gold watch suspended about her neck and nodded. For a long time they were quiet. The sound of the churchgoers and died away. The lights in the houses went out. There were no stars. Once a man with a lantern went by along the railroad tracks, but the rest of the time it was very dark.

"What time is it?" The watch by the light of a match showed an hour to wait. That was the longest hour of all. Nothing in the world seemed alive but the boy and girl, out there alone in the darkness under the ragged clouds.

"What time is it?" She struck a match. It went out. Another, which she held in the cup of her hands. The watch showed half-past 2.

The boy arose, lifting his hand from his pocket as he did so.

"Good-by," he said, and fled. A watchman on the railroad track heard the shot and the girl's scream and ran to her. The boy was dead and she was kneeling over him. It was a long time before she could tell the story.

COMPENSATION WILL GET STUDY

Leaders Are Opposed to Making Any Changes Without Due Consideration



Officials of the State Workmen's Compensation Bureau are of the opinion that changes to the compensation act of 1915 would be made gradually and with as much care as was exercised in dealing with the coal code. It is the belief at the Capitol that the success of the school code and the soft coal code was largely due to the thorough try-out both acts were given. The idea is that the compensation system should be given the same trial and that the next legislature should enact changes only when they have been tested.

The suggestion that all insurance of liability should be confined to the State fund does not meet with much favor at the Capitol and if this proposition is pushed it is likely that there will be much opposition. Officials decline to commit themselves on the proposition to raise the death benefit from fifty to sixty-six and two-thirds per cent.

Chairman Mackey is quoted in Philadelphia as saying that the Board has handled 7,500 cases without trouble and that demonstrates that the system is working fairly well.

Rausch Pushing Work. — Lieutenant-Colonel L. V. Rausch is pushing along the work on preparation of the Mt. Gretna camp site for the Guardsmen and the place will be ready the usual time in advance. The tests of the water are being made by Paul Hooker, one of the sanitary engineering force from Commissioner Dixon's department.

To Speak at DuBois. — W. R. D. Hall, statistician of the State Highway Department, will speak on good roads and State-wide good roads day at the banquet of the DuBois Chamber of Commerce to-morrow night.

Will Return To-night. — Dr. C. J. Marshall, State veterinarian, is expected to return to the State Capitol to-night after his trip to Europe. He has been busy at his Philadelphia office gathering up details.

Protests Filed. — Protests have been filed against the approval of charters for the two big Lawrence county power companies which were approved by the Public Service Commission last week. The companies' charters are now before the Governor.

Offices Open. — The Adjutant General's, Public Service, Health and State Police departments were open to-day looking after things. Other departments were closed.

Seventeen Examined. — Seventeen men were examined for the ten vacancies for the State Police Department yesterday and the troops will be recruited at once.

Meeting To-morrow. — The Public Service Commission will have an executive session to-morrow to dispose of matters which have accumulated since Wednesday.

Meet on 24th. — The State Board of Pardons meeting, ordinarily scheduled for the third Wednesday will be held on May 24.

Meeting at Scranton. — The State Historical Commission has arranged for a meeting at Scranton on May 26. At that time a marker will be dedicated.
