the result of the primary, so far as it relates to the national crisis, will be the absolute renouncing of the Republican protection of the State and country.

Men familiar with State politics declared that the total vote for Republican delegates-at-large in Philadelphia, if close, would indicate what the State would do on the delegation at large.

Philadelphia, May 17.—Interest in the first presidential preferential primary election in Pennsylvania yesterday was overshadowed by the contest for the leadership of the Republican party in which United States Senator Boies Penrose apparently was victorious over Governor Brumbaugh after one of the bitterest fights in the history of the organization.

Counting of the votes was very slow owing to the enormous size of the ballot and returns received from the State up to 7 a. m. were meager.

There were only two candidates on the presidential preferential ballots, President Wilson on the Democratic and Governor Brumbaugh on the Republican, but Henry Ford, the Detroit manufacturer, received a surprisingly large number of votes by the use of his name.

Former President Roosevelt, United States Supreme Court Justice Hughes and others received a scattered vote from admirers who wrote in their names.

The male passengers thus approached look at the girl in astonishment and when they saw she was serious, most of them murmured they already were married. The girl pleaded with twenty men with tears in her eyes and almost had persuaded one youth to take upon himself the burdens of matrimony, when Policeman Frank J. Duffy boarded the train and placed the girl under arrest.

The girl, who gave her name as Rose Malushko, was arraigned before Alderman Frank Freese, and sent to jail to await action of court.
