STANFORD FINDS PEARL 5,000,000 YEARS OLD

Stanford University, Cal.—A 5,000,000-year-old pearl has been discovered by Stanley Carrollton Herold.

Professors of the department confirm Herold's estimate. The fossil pearl is declared to be the oldest ever found.

It originated in the Eocene age, eons before there was any sign of man on earth.

Herold has made a special study of the geologic and paleontologic conditions of the Pacific coast in that period.

The pearl measures more than an eighth of an inch in diameter and has faded to a light brown from its original cream color.

The oyster shell came with a batch of experimental material from the vicinity of Puget Sound, Washington.
