HARRISBURG LUMBER HOUSES CARRY COMPLETE STOCKS

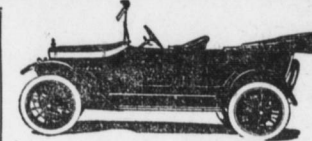
