RAILROAD RUMBLES

CHARGE JOBBING IN ARBITRATION

Trainmen Assert Violation of Western Decree by Managers; Discuss 8-Hour Demand

New York, June 3.—After a brief discussion respecting the representation of the different roads and classes of employees, the joint conference of railroad managers and heads of the four great railroad labor organizations yesterday took up consideration of the chief question that brought them together—the demand of the employees for an eight-hour basis of pay.

This and other demands presented to the railroad lines March 30 were read into the record of the conference by A. R. Garretson, president of the conductors' organization and the accepted spokesman of the labor delegates.

The discussion revolved around the question of overtime on the eight-hour basis, which bids fair to be one of the leading issues of the conference.

Much controversy centered around the payment of "arbitrators"—the length of time between when the trainmen report for duty and when they leave on their runs.

Timothy Shea for the workers, asserted that the roads had violated at least the intent of the award of the Western Board of Arbitration.
