**3,000 Car Workers to Get 20 Per Cent. Wage Increase**  
 Berwick, Pa., June 6.—Announcement was made here yesterday of an increase of 20 per cent. in all piecework rates throughout the Berwick car departments of the American Car and Foundry Company. The increase dates from June 1 and will affect 3,000 men. The piecework increase goes

higher than the rate asked by the strikers in the steel plant.  
 The announcement was also made that a revision of day schedules throughout the car departments will soon be effected. An increase in the day rates in the steel plant, where 300 men are on strike, was also announced. It is thought an agreement will be reached soon.

**\$150,000 Bridge to Be Built at Montgomery**  
 Williamsport, Pa., June 6.—Judge Harvey W. Whitehead yesterday directed the Lycoming county commissioners to build a bridge across the west branch of the Susquehanna river at Montgomery.  
 The bridge will cost \$150,000. The

commissioners were ordered weeks ago to build a bridge over the stream at Dubolstown. The cost of this will be \$180,000. A bond issue will be necessary to secure the money.

**SEVENTEEN LOYAL PROVINCES**  
 Washington, D. C., June 6.—The seventeen loyal provinces in China have agreed to continue their support to President Yuan Fhi Kai. Minister Reinsch, at Pekin, telegraphed to-day that representatives of the provinces had reached this decision at a meeting in Nanking.

**SALE OF \$30,000,000 LAND**  
 Washington, D. C., June 6.—The House yesterday adopted a conference report on the bill to reclaim and sell \$30,000,000 worth of land granted to the California and Oregon Railroad.

It was adopted last week by the Senate.

**Russia Is in Market For Many More Big Locomotives**  
 Inquiries are being made here by Russia for between 600 and 1,000 locomotives of the same type as those purchased last year, costing between \$27,000 and \$30,000. Last year Russia made inquiries for from 400 to 600 locomotives, and placed orders for 250 here and 50 in Canada.  
 Last year business went to the American Locomotive Company and the Baldwin Locomotive Works.

**BANDIT LOPEZ EXECUTED**  
 Chihuahua City, Mexico, June 6.—Pablo Lopez, Villa's chief lieutenant in

the raid upon Columbus, N. M., yesterday paid the penalty for his crimes, facing a firing squad of Constitutional soldiers at Santa Rosa, Chihuahua's place of execution.

**WILL OPEN BIDS**  
 Enola, Pa., June 6. — On Saturday next bids for the erection of the new school building on Summit street, will be opened by the School Board. C. Howard Lloyd of Harrisburg is the architect.  
 The building is to be 115 feet long and 62 feet wide, and when completed will be the most modernly equipped fireproof building on the West Shore. It will contain eight school rooms and an auditorium which will accommodate 500.

**COWS KILLED BY LIGHTNING**  
 Lebanon, Pa., June 6. — Six cows, valued at \$900, owned by D. R. Royer, a farmer living north of this city, were killed by a stroke of lightning on Saturday afternoon while huddled under an oak tree.

**LIGHTNING SHATTERS DWELLING**  
 Elizabethtown, Pa., June 6. — During a severe thunder storm that passed over this valley on Saturday evening, lightning struck the house occupied by A. E. Koppenheffer, west of town, shattering the west side of the house.

**SAMUEL TAYLOR DIES**  
 Millertown, Pa., June 6. — Samuel Taylor, one of the oldest citizens of town, died on Sunday evening after an illness of about three weeks.
