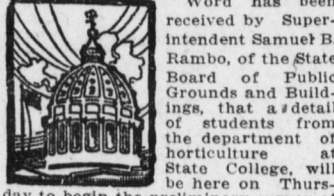
John Sides, superintendent of the Halifax Stripping Company, and Miss Esther Koller, of Royalton, were married Saturday evening at Halifax.
