RACES AT RALAMAZOO Special to the Telegraph Kalamazoo, Mich., July 31. — Fresh from the most successfur week in the jistory of the grand circuit harness racing in Detroit, the stars of the light harness world to-day will begin a five days' meeting here. Three events, with the Rickman Hotel purse, a \$2000 stake, as a feature, are on the first day's card. Large fields rule. Eighteen horses have been named to go in the stake race, while the other two races, a 2:15 pace and a 2:09 trot, have drawn, respectively, twenty and fifteen starters. Both of the last named are for purses of \$1000. The Paper Mills purse, a \$10,000 stake, is on the program for Wednes-day. It is for 2.08 trotters and has drawn twenty-one entries. It will be raced on the four-heat plan.
