

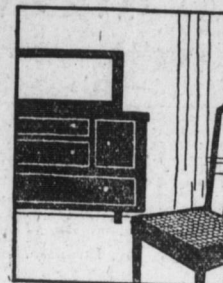

SWIFTS GIVE TWO MILLIONS

30,000 Men and Women Eligible to Come Under Big Pension Fund

Chicago, Ill., July 31.—Two million dollars was the gift made by Swift & Company to their employees to-day. Announcement of the accumulation of this sum during the past six years in the form of a pension fund occasioned much gratification to workers in the plants and branch houses in all cities where it was made simultaneously. It is estimated that more than 30,000 men and women are eligible, in time, to come under the provisions of the fund, which becomes active August 1.

One of the striking features of the plan as outlined is that the employees do not contribute to the fund, the company furnishing absolutely all the money needed to pay pensions. In this connection it is expected that Swift & Company will be called upon to pay \$400,000 a year in addition to the income from the fund, in order to meet the demands of the plan.

In Chicago alone, 8,000 persons will come under the plan as outlined. The pension board as organized will consist of five members who are officers or employees of Swift & Company. "Swift & Company have had a pension plan under consideration for over six years and during that time have accumulated for the purpose a fund of two million dollars," said Louis F. Swift, president of the company, to-day. "In that time we have studied dozens of pension plans in effect in other organizations, both contributory and non-contributory and we believe that we have selected the best points of these and have added a number of good features that are distinctive. We have made it possible for every man and woman in our employ to provide for his or her old age simply by giving efficient work and continuous service."

The salient points of the plan as outlined in the formal announcement to employees follow: The employees do not contribute to the fund. The income from the \$2,000,000 foundation fund to be supplemented annually by Swift & Company until the fund is large enough to meet the necessary demands; more than 30,000 employees to benefit; men in the employ of the company twenty-five years, who have reached the age of sixty may be pensioned; men in the employ of the company twenty-five years and who have reached the age of sixty-five shall be pensioned; women in service twenty-five years, who have reached the age of fifty-five shall be pensioned; women in service twenty-five years, who have reached the age of fifty-five shall be pensioned. Employees in service fifteen years and up to twenty-five years, who are permanently incapacitated for work may be pensioned; pension of those retired on account of age and length of service, or if incapacitated after a service of twenty-five years, but prior to the age of retirement, shall be one-half of the average salary for the five years preceding retirement; pension of those retiring on account of incapacity after from fifteen to twenty-five years of service shall be computed on a basis of one and one-half per cent of the average salary for the five-year period preceding retirement; for each year of continuous service; no pension shall be less than \$240 per year; no pension shall be in excess of \$5,000 per year.

Carlisle Indian Students Earn \$35,000 During Season

Carlisle, Pa., July 31.—A report just issued by Superintendent Lippe of the Carlisle Indian School, shows clearly how the Indian is progressing and fitting to work as an employee or wage-earner. The report includes the work of the students of the school under the outing system during 1916. In all, 2,000 male students, earned \$21,190.81 during the year. The girls, acting as domestics and nurses, earned \$3,978.61.

The largest percentage was made in the Ford factory of 29 boys, who have been there under apprentice system for periods of from three to 12 months. They earned \$18,562, and of this sum saved \$4,640.50, or 25 per cent of their earnings. Five boys earned \$1,000 during the year and \$500 each. A portion of all earnings are turned over to the school bank to be kept until the students graduate. Farming activity brought a return of \$10,729.41 to the 200 boys who engaged in this vocation.

Senate Takes Up Child Labor Bill Under Spur

Washington, July 31.—The Senate will take up the child labor bill this week and under spur of a demand by President Wilson pass it before adjournment despite staff opposition to the measure. The bill has come from the measure will be sought in efforts to attach as a ride the immigration bill which with its literacy test it is believed might draw a presidential vote. The main fight on the bill has come from cotton manufacturers in the South and from the National Association of Manufacturers. As it passed the House the measure provides that there shall be no shipments in interstate or foreign commerce of the output of mines or quarries in which employed children under 14. Opponents contend the bill is unconstitutional.

Senator Robinson, who reported the bill from the commerce committee, said to-day he hoped to get it before the Senate by Tuesday, when a pending appropriation bill will have been passed.

STRAIGHTEN CROOKED LINE

Fresno, Cal., July 30.—The St. Joaquin and Eastern Railway Company's line through the Sierra, from El Prado to Cascade, which is called the crookedest road in the world, is to be straightened, and at the same time the dams at Huntington Lake will be raised from 160 feet to 210 feet. Construction Engineer Starr, of the Pacific Light and Power Company, at G. G. Watson, general manager of the railroad, have just made a trip over the Yosemite Valley railroad. It is a general plan to straighten the road and reduce the grade so that ordinary engines can pull trains into the mountains.

MRS MARY A. STRINE DIES
